Note: Jews count the books of the Bible differently than Christians. For instance, the twelve “minor prophets” are counted as one book. Similarly, 1 & 2 Samuel, 1 & 2 Kings, 1 & 2 Chronicles are combined, making for 3 books instead of 6. In addition, Ezra & Nehemiah are counted as one. Thus, they count 24 books in their canon instead of the 39 of the Christian Old Testament.
